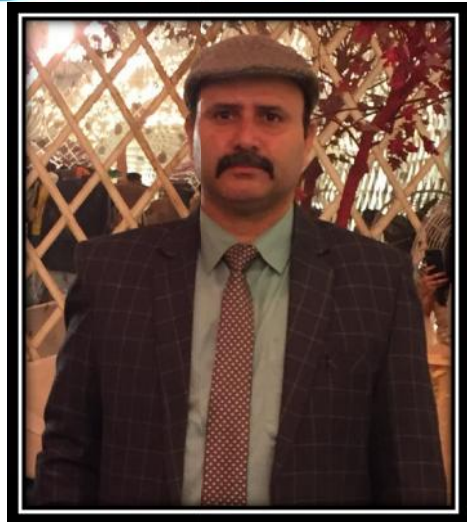
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From Principal's Desk

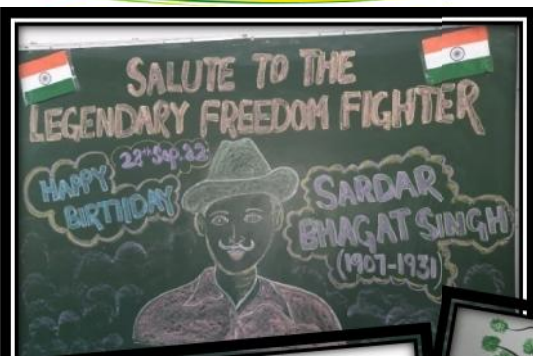
Seminar on Fire Safety and First Aid

Mathematical Modeling



Mathematical modeling refers to the process of creating a mathematical representation of a real-world scenario to make a prediction or provide insight. There is a distinction between applying a formula and the actual creation of a mathematical relationship.

Real-world, messy problems can be approached with mathematics, resulting in a range of possible solutions to help guide decision making. Both students and teachers are sometimes uncomfortable with the notion of math modeling because it is so open-ended. So much unknown information seems prohibitive.

And what factors are most relevant? But it is this open-ended nature of real-world problems that leads to building and applying problem solving skills, creativity, innovation, and mathematics.

Mathematical modeling can be thought of as an iterative process made up of the following components.

Identify the Problem because modeling problems are open-ended, the modeler must be specific in defining what it is they would like to find out.

Make Assumptions and Identify Variables Since it is impossible to account for all the important factors in a given situation, the modeler must make choices about what to incorporate in their representation of the real-world. Making assumptions helps reveal the variables that will be considered and also reduce the number of them by deciding not to include everything. Within this process, relationships between variables will emerge based on observations, physical laws, or simplifications.

Do the Math Eventually, a relationship between input and output will allow for a solution to be found.

Analyze and Assess the Solution When considering the results and insights gained from the model, one asks if the answer makes sense.

Iterate Usually, the model can be refined and the process can be repeated to improve the model's performance.

Implement the Model and Report Results A clear report on the model and its implementation makes the model understandable to others.

Making mental Health a priority among children

Counseling sessions by a psychological Counselor, workshops, and seminars can be encouraged.

Further, students should be taught not to worry about anticipated judgment from peers, to trust their own journey and that self-care is most important. There is a difference between reel life and real life. One should just try to be the best version of themselves and “be imperfectly perfect” should be the attitude worn Teachers can play the role of a mentor, and guide and should instill a feeling in the child that they are there to hear them out without being judgmental.

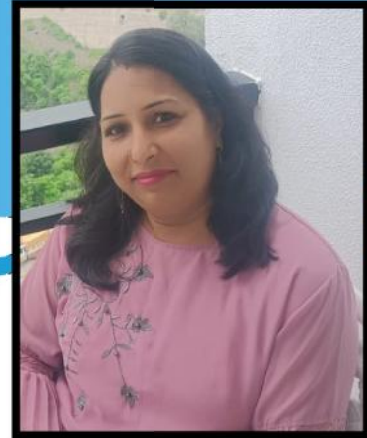

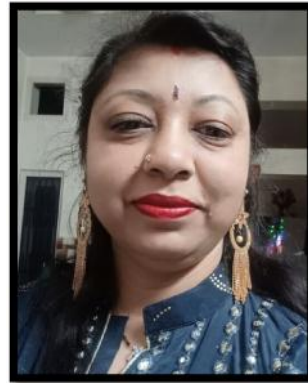

Successes and Challenges of the INDIAN Education System

With a population of over 1.2 billion, India's education system is expected to be one of the largest and most complex in the world, only comparable in sheer size to its neighbor the Republic of China. Half of the population is below the age of 25, and the 2011 census indicated an adult literacy rate of 74% which is a remarkable compared to the 12% figure, registered at the end of the British Raj. All of this translates to a staggering 1.4 million schools across India, 230 million enrolments in school and colleges, and over 25 million new college graduates every year.



India's higher education produces yearly, many skilled individuals in the engineering and IT field. With that tremendous amount of man power, and with experts predicting a steadily increase in growth of the working-age population and thus, bound to become one of the leading economies of the next decades. However, all these forecasts of perceivable bright future might be masking deep rooted problems still present within India's Education system.

According to the study from Cheney, Ruzzi and Mureldharan for the National Centre on Education and Economy (NCEE) the Indian education has elitist tendencies for a long time, going back as far as the 18th Century, with a high caste group (Brahmin) having persisted in the Modern education system with a three-tiered system branching off in three different groups for high, middle and lower classes respectively. Nonetheless numerous efforts have been made in past decades to increase in availability of education throughout the Nation. One of such efforts was the Indian Education Commission formed in 1964, better known as the Kothari Commission at that moment that multiple guidelines and policies were established to modernize and standardize the structure of education system with recommendation still relevant to this date, such as 10+2 + 3 pattern is used to nationalise.

One of the major issues in today's Indian education system is the fact that around 70% of the population resides in rural areas, people living in these areas have fewer resources to court in compared to their counterparts in bigger cities. The drive in more infrastructural constraints for the poorer, a higher student ratio and an increasing gap of quality of education between different social strata. Solving all these issues is not an easy task, providing standardized high level education very costly, and not only in India but also worldwide. And in add to this India is one of most culturally, diverse countries in the world with over 100 languages and a thousand dialects only increasing the challenge the Education system has to face.

- Given that we live in globally competitive environment in this day and age, it's essential that the Indian education system continues to improve the standard to match those of the more economically advanced countries. The path is not easy, but the potential exist can be exploited

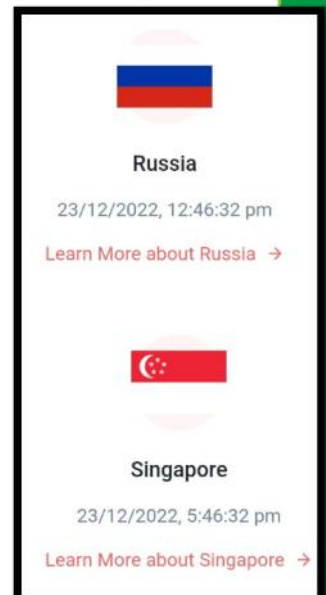
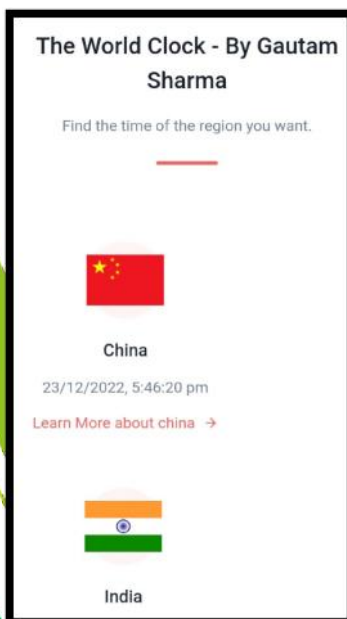
